	i	Future perfect 'will have written' indicates an action completed before a future time. For example: 'The book is completed by the deadline'.
~	A B C	When I called him, he(read) a book. read was reading has read reads

	i Past continuous 'was reading' describes an ongoing action when another past event happened. Common in narratives.

	i Simple past 'met' conveys an action completed in the past. Single events in the past fit this tense.
